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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

M. A. FRENCH

As outlined in its vision and mission, the Master's program in FRENCH represents one of the prime initiatives of core programme development at SOFL. This is the first ever Master's Programme in French Language in the Open and Distance Mode at an Indian University.

The program has been developed in response to the high learner demand for an M.A. degree in one of the most opted for foreign languages in India. It is designed as a modern learner friendly Master's program in the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Mode (to be subsequently offered in Online Mode too)

1. The program follows a Modular structure allowing 02 points of exit -- after the 1st year with a Postgraduate Diploma in French and on completion of the 2nd year, with a full Masters degree -- M.A. French.
2. The courses have been developed keeping in mind both traditional components of a Masters program as well as those that are skill oriented and focused upon applied aspects of language learning.

Objectives of the programme:

The programme is designed to:

1. Offer advanced degree in French and Francophone studies through Open and Distance Learning Mode to learners from diverse backgrounds .
2. Present to learners a modern, innovative and learner friendly pedagogical model based on latest techniques and technology enabled learning tools.

3. Help learners have access to contemporary and relevant topics of study incorporating both traditional topics as well as recent additions.
4. Initiate learners into theoretical as well as applied aspects of translation and didactics in foreign languages
5. Introduce the basics of French and francophone culture, civilization, history and literature.
6. Familiarize them with perspectives on Open, Online and Distributed learning

Target Learners:

The M.A. French (modular) programme at IGNOU targets adult students and professionals who :-

-

- Have completed their undergraduate degrees, are employed and wishing to continue studies along with work
- Wish to continue advanced degrees in French Studies but in restrictive life conditions with limited mobility
- Want to resume Postgraduate studies after a considerable break in learning cycles
- Are in full time employment and looking for more flexible and learner-centric pedagogic models of Education
- International students willing to pursue M.A. French in ODL/ Online mode.
- Learners who are willing to join the teaching profession and desirous of pursuing subsequently higher research degree programs in French.
- Those wanting to appear at the JRF-NET Exams in India conducted by the University Grants Commission (UGC).

Duration:

The proposed M.A. French will be a two years modular programme divided into four semesters

consisting of 72 credits with exit Option with a Post Graduate Diploma in French after the completion of the first year course (36 credits).

This can be resumed again to complete the remaining 01 year of the programme and earn the degree of M.A. French.

[Minimum duration: 2 years and Max. duration: 4 years]

Credits:

A student is required to complete 72 credits (whereas 1 credit is equivalent to 30 hours of study time) for the completion of programme and the award of degree.

Intended Learning Outcomes :

Upon completion of the programme students should be able to demonstrate:

- Competence in French and Francophone studies – History, Culture, Literature and Civilization.
- Competence in translation/interpretation – Theory & Applied Speech and Texts from English to French and vice versa.
- Knowledge and understanding of Research Methodology from basics to advanced techniques.
- Ability to understand fundamentals of Linguistics and its role in teaching/learning of the French language.
- Ability to handle teaching/learning of French as a Foreign language using online tools, digital portals and formulate customized , relevant pedagogical material.
- Knowledge of literature, history and culture of francophone cultures across the world.

FRAMEWORK

The programme will be based on IGNOU's teaching approach of Open and Distance learning, which facilitates learners to register irrespective of their place of origin and age group, thereby allowing students to continue their study along with their personal responsibilities and professional commitments

Eligibility:

Candidates seeking admission to the M.A. French programme should fulfil any **ONE** of the following criteria :

A) Three (03) Years Bachelors Programme (Undergraduate Degree) in French (French Hons) from any recognized Indian or Foreign University.

OR

B) Any Undergraduate Degree from a recognized Indian or Foreign University with **Four (04) semesters (02 years) of French as major subject at Undergraduate Level**

+

UGC certified Diploma in French (B1 level) from a recognized Indian/Foreign University or Certified Institution.

OR

C) Undergraduate Degree in **any subject** from a recognized Indian or Foreign University

+

UGC certified Advanced Diploma in French (B2 Level or higher) from a recognized Indian/Foreign University or Certified Institution as per university regulations.

Evaluation:

- The evaluation shall be done through continuous assessments and term-end examination as per University's evaluation norms.

Medium:

French/English

Fee Structure:

Fees for the full period to be paid is Rs.12,500/- with year-wise fee of Rs.6,225/- each. In the first year it is Rs. 6225/- which includes Registration Fee as per University regulations.

Admission Cycle : Admissions are conducted twice a year in July and January Sessions.

SCHEME OF STUDY

A. Counselling Sessions / Weekend contact classes

Though distance learning encourages self-learning greatly, contact classes are considered important features of the programme.

You will be helped by trained academic counselors/ subject experts who will hold discussions, clarify doubts, promote peer discussions and go through the materials provided to you in the relevant course that is being conducted in progression.

The contact sessions will be majorly in online mode and schedules shall be communicated to you in advance about timings by the Regional Centre. Though not mandatory, it is beneficial to actively participate in the weekend contact sessions/tutorials to remain abreast with the discussions and any other query/clarification regarding assignments, projects and submission schedules.

B. Text / Written Content

In an ODL model of study, the text materials constitute the main

Constituents of the instructional set, which are called the Self Learning Materials (SLMs).

These shall be made available to you in sequence as the programme progresses (in digital mode followed by print)

C. Audio-Video Resources

Audio lectures followed by video lecture sessions will be part of the pedagogical support material provided. They shall be based on the text material provided and will reflect distinctly Blocks and Units as found in the text.

D. Interactive Radio Sessions on AIR Gyan-Vani and Gyan-Darshan

Radio-based lectures or television sessions based on topics related to the courses in M.A. French will be made available from time to time.

Prior information on telecast and broadcast timings, presentation details etc. will be made available to learners.

EVALUATION -- SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Learners will be subject to :

- a. Continuous Assessment, 30% weightage
and
- b. Term End Examinations 70% weightage

Continuous assessment shall comprise of 01 assignment submission per course. Submissions will be done at respective regional centres and evaluated by the regional centres / academic counselors.

Topics for each course will be announced and learners can choose 01 topic for preparing the Assignment.

Only upon submission of all assignments will a candidate be eligible to sit for the Term End Examinations.

Term End Exams will be written and conducted at specified centres across India in offline mode.

Examination Fee

Student will have to pay Rs.50/- for each course as examination fee and in case of failing to secure pass marks in any of the courses, will have to reappear in that course after paying the fee @ Rs. 50/- per course.

Examination Date Sheet

Examination Date Sheet (Schedule which indicated the date and time of examination for each course) is put on the IGNOU website (www.ignou.ac.in) well in advance.

Examination Centre (s)

Normally the study centre is the examination centre. However, a student is required to fill the exam centre code in the examination form.

For the purpose you are advised to go through the list of study centers available in the Student Handbook and Prospectus/Programme Guide. In case any student wishes to take examination at a particular centre, the code of the chosen centre be filled up as examination centre code. However, examination centre chosen by a student, if not activated, the University will allot another examination centre under the same Region.

Examination Form

Filling up of examination form is compulsory for taking Term-end examination. A copy of the Examination form is given in the Programme Guide. You can use it or download examination form from the IGNOU website i.e. www.ignou.ac.in. Examination form can be submitted as per the following scheme:

Issue of Examination Hall Ticket

The University issues Examination Hall Ticket to the students at least two week before the commencement of Term-end Examination. The same could also be downloaded from the University's website www.ignou.ac.in.

In case any student fails to receive the Examination Hall Ticket within one week before the commencement of the examination, he/she can download the hall ticket from the website and approach the exam centre for appearing in the exam.

Eligibility for Examination

Before taking examination a student should meet the following conditions:

- i) . Submitted the assignments prescribed for that course
- ii) Submitted the examination form within prescribed dates
- iii) Submitted the examination fee as prescribed

Admit Card

After receiving the examination forms from you, the University will send admit card to you before the commencement of examination. If you do not receive the admit card 15 days before the commencement of examinations, you may contact the Regional Director. If your name is registered for examinations in

the list sent to the Study Centre, even if you have not received admit card or misplaced it, you can take the examination by showing your Identity Card (Student Card) to the examination centre superintendent.

Every student must bring identity card for appearing in Term End Examination along with the Admit Card.

The top of the first page of your response sheet should look like this:

1. Write your Enrolment Number, Name, Full Address, Signature and Date on the top right hand corner of the first page of your response sheet.

2. Write the Programme Title, Course Code, Assignment number and Name of your Study Centre on the left hand corner of the first page of your response sheet.

Course Code and Assignment Code may be reproduced from the assignment.

3. Read the assignments carefully and follow the specific instructions, if any given on the assignment itself about the subject matter or its presentation.

4. Use only foolscap size paper for your response and tie all the pages carefully. Avoid using very thin paper. Allow a 4 cm margin on the left and at least 4 lines in between each answer. This may facilitate the evaluator to write useful comments in the margin at appropriate places.

5. Write the responses in your own hand. Do not print or type the answers.

6. Do not copy from the response sheets of other students. If copying is noticed, the assignments of such students will be rejected.

7. Write each assignment separately. All the assignments should not be written in continuity.

8. Write the question number and the question with each answer.

9. The completed assignment should be submitted to counselor of your respective centers.. Under any circumstances do not send the tutor marked response sheets to the student Registration and Evaluation Division at the Head Quarters for evaluation.

10. After submitting the assignment gets the acknowledgement from the counselor on the prescribed assignment remittance-cum-acknowledgement card.

Examination Centre

The University at its discretion may allot you any examination centre. Change of examination centre is not generally permitted. In exceptional cases change of centre may be considered.

Your enrolment number is your Roll Number for examinations. Be careful in writing it. Any mistake in writing the Roll Number will result in non-declaration of your result.

Declaration of Result

It is your duty to check whether you are registered for that course and whether you are eligible to appear for that examination or not. If you neglect this and take the examination without being eligible

for it, your result will be cancelled.

Although all efforts are made to declare the result in time, there will be no binding on the University to declare the results of the last examination before commencement of next examination. You are therefore, advised to fill up the form without necessarily waiting for the result and get it cancelled at a later date if so required.

While communicating with the University regarding examination, please clearly write your enrolment number and complete address. In the absence of such details, the University will not be able to attend to your problems.

Refund of Fees

Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances whatsoever.
